2023 CACREP Vital Statistics Report Master's Program in Professional Clinical Counseling

Each year, the Master's Program in Professional Clinical Counseling submits a Vital Statistics Report to its accrediting body, The Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP). This report is a requirement of all CACREP-accredited programs, and must be publicly reported on the program website annually. The following information is for academic year 2022-2023:

- Number of graduates in the past year: 25
Reflects the combined total number of graduates from Summer 2022, Fall 2022, and Spring 2023.
- Program completion rate: 85%
Reflects the percentage of admitted students who graduate from the program within the required time (7 years). Note that completion rates are difficult to measure with precision as students may transfer internally to another program that is a better fit or decide to discontinue for personal or professional reasons (e.g., a conferred degree is no longer required).
- Licensure examination pass rate: 80%
Reflects the National Counselor Exam (NCE) pass rate. It should be noted that this only includes reporting data from Fall 2022, in which only 5 students took the exam.
- Job placement rate of graduates: 100%
Reflects the percentage of graduates actively seeking employment within 180 days of the date they received their master's counseling degree who obtained employment in a recognized or related comparable occupation for which they were trained.
